"GALACTIC AND SOLAR RADIO WAVES," Mr. Reber's subject in October, will deal with astronomical radio investigations from the discovery of Jansky in 1932 to the present time. The field of work may be divided into two parts: the radio radiation coming from the Milky Way, and the solar radiation in the radio spectrum. Consideration will be given to the astrophysical implications and matters of practical importance which the study of these radiations may reveal. He will explain the present program of the National Bureau of Standards in this direction. Mr. Reber is a radio engineer in the Experimental Ionospheric Research Section of the Central Radio Propagation Laboratory.
